We have granted an EIA Consent for this project; the EIA Consent Decision Report can be viewed at <u>https://www.daera-ni.gov.uk/publications/application-marine-</u> <u>licence-extension-existing-coastal-defence-curran-strand-portrush-notice</u>

The Department has determined that the potential environmental impacts of this proposal have been adequately identified, described and assessed in the EIA Consent Decision Report and that mitigation can be secured to allow the marine licence to be approved.

The main concerns expressed related to the possible exacerbation of coastal erosion due the proposed structure. The concerns focused on coastal processes, climate change and nature conservation. Each of the topics are considered in detail within Section 6 of the EIA Consent Decision Report.

Section 6.1 covers Coastal Processes and sets out the requirement for mitigation to be included in the licence conditions. With regard to coastal processes, the licence conditions will require Environmental Monitoring Plan to be agreed with the Department. This plan will allow for ongoing monitoring of the structure throughout its lifetime and will provide a mechanism through which the structure may be removed, if found to be having a significant environmental impact.

The Environmental Monitoring Plan also has regard to the concerns expressed over potential impacts on Climate Change on the coastline. Monitoring of the impacts of this structure will also help to address the concerns expressed in section 6.2 of the EIA Consent Decision Report regarding climate change.

Section 6.3 outlines the concerns relating to Biodiversity and Nature Conservation. Further to responses received during the consultation process, the marine licence will be conditioned to require the applicant to carry out relevant habitat surveys prior to work commencing, along with ensuring no work is undertaken during the bird breeding season.

Section 6.4 outlines the concerns relating to Water Quality and Section 6.6 the concerns relating to Cultural Heritage Assets.
