1.0 Purpose of Report

1.1 The purpose of this report is to update Elected Members on the annual Council insurance renewal post European Journal procurement exercise.

2.0 Background

- 2.1 Annually the Council has in place a range of 16 insurance policies that are procured by the Broker via the European Journal. There have been a range of issues over the last number of years such as lack of market competition and price increases.
- 2.2 The insurance market is difficult to predict in terms of trends and cost increases and a budget was set for 2024/25 of £1,635,679.00. The result of the European Journal procurement exercise is a number of cost fluctuations across the insurance policies, but the actual overall increase is 4.35%, much lower than predicted.
- 2.3 Each year the Council liaises with the insurance broker to assess the financial position with regard to control of costs and as part of this review the option of self- insurance is considered. This review will take place in September 2024.

3.0 <u>Recommendation(s)</u>

It is recommended that the Corporate Policy and Resources Committee recommends to Council that this Report is noted.
