# 1.0 <u>Purpose of Report</u>

The purpose of this report is to seek approval from Members for a Capital Grant Scheme, along with associated budget and staffing resource, which will be targeted towards sporting, community & voluntary groups.

## 2.0 <u>Strategic Aim</u>

To support external infrastructure projects, aligned to Council's aims and objectives, that require additional capital funding for the development of new or the enhancement of existing facilities to meet unmet need.

The grant scheme will only fund community and voluntary sector organisations for capital works at 50% subvention rate. (Capital expenditure is considered to be one-time large purchases of fixed assets).

#### 3.0 Amount of Grant-aid

A total capital grant pot of  $\pounds$ 600,000 per annum is proposed. This budget includes all resource and staff costs associated with the administration and management of the grant programme which are currently projected at  $\pounds$ 50,000 per annum.

### 4.0 Options for allocation of funding

Two options are presented for consideration by Members.

### 4.1 **Option 1**:

Council is committed to distributing grants fairly, efficiently and effectively. In order to allow access for all sporting codes, it is proposed that no single sporting code can have access to more than 40% of the overall funding pot in any given year. It is further proposed that community projects will have access to a maximum of 20% of the pot in any given year.

### 4.2 **Option 2**:

Council is committed to distributing grants fairly, efficiently and effectively. In order to allow grant funding access to as large a number of organisations as possible, it is proposed that no single organisation can have access to more than 20% of the overall funding pot in any given year.

# 5.0 Selection & Assessment

To be considered for grant-aid, applications must score the quality threshold of 65%. The criteria to be used for assessment and award is attached in **Annex A**.

Council will consider grant aid up to a maximum of 50% of total capital project costs up to a maximum total grant value as per option 1 or option 2.

The level of grant awarded will depend on the following:

- The available budget.
- The number of applications.

Organisations must match fund the remaining 50% from other sources or from their own resources (in kind contributions will not be considered).

The capital grants should be drawn down within a 5-year time frame from the date of grant award.

Organistions/projects that have received a capital grant from Council in the last 3 years (from date of final payment from Council) will not be eligible for an award.

### 7.0 <u>Recommendation:</u>

It is recommended that the Leisure & Development Committee:

- 1. Approve a £600,000 per annum capital grant programme.
- 2. Approve the appointment of a Capital Grants Officer at a cost of approximately £50,000 per annum (included in the £600k).
- 3. Approve either Option 1 or Option 2 for the fair distribution of the capital grant scheme.
- 4. Approve the criteria as set out in **Annex A**.

# **Eligibility Criteria**

All applications will be assessed against the following eligibility criteria. Applications must score a "pass" in all eligibility criterion.

	Criterion	Pass	Fail
1	Applications must be from properly constituted not for profit community or voluntary groups. Council will carry out due diligence of legal status.		
2	Applications will only be considered from Sports Clubs and Community projects geographically located within the Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council area.		
3	Applications will be considered ineligible if either the applicant organisation or the site where the project is to be based have received any capital investment from Council in the past three years		
4	Applicants must submit final signed accounts for the previous two financial years. Only those organisations that Council considers to be financially sound will be considered eligible.
