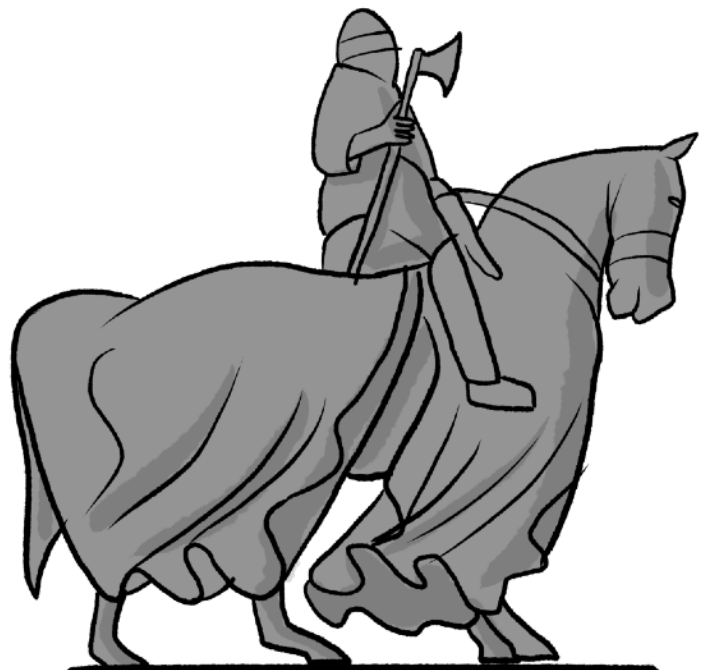

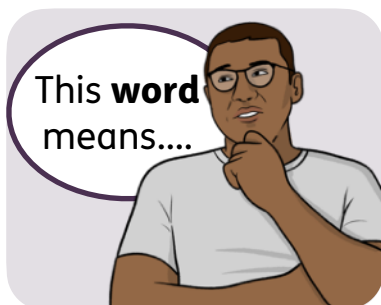
This is an Easy Read version of some information. It may not include all of the information but it will tell you about the important parts.



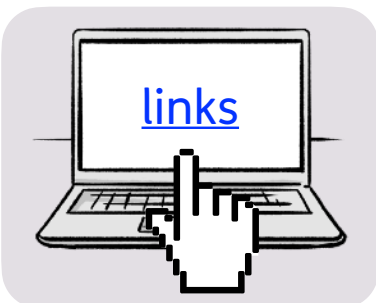
This Easy Read booklet uses easier words and pictures. Some people may still want help to read it.

Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council is writing rules for how we make choices about **memorials**.

Why we are doing this

Our draft plan helps us to decide who can have a memorial and where in a fair and open way.

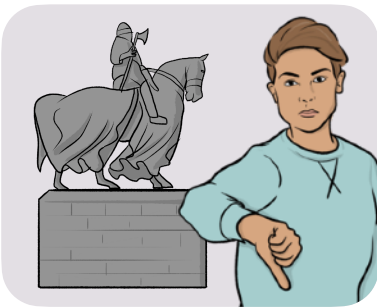


It also explains what we and people who ask for a memorial must do when we think about whether to have a memorial.

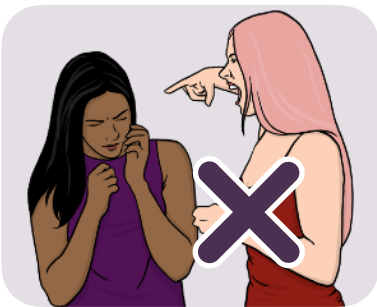
Being fair



We must treat everyone fairly.



We must think about whether a memorial will cause some local people to be unhappy, or complain.



Memorials must not stop different local communities from respecting and getting on with each other.



A group, called the **Council Memorial Advisory Group** will look at whether a memorial will cause problems.



They can stop the memorial from being built if it will be unfair for local people.



The group will be made up of people from different **political parties** on the council.

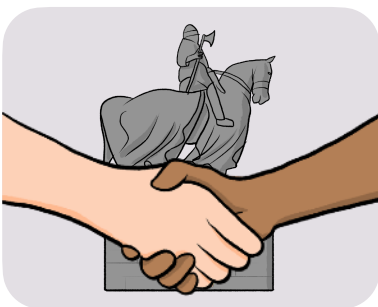
Political parties are groups that make choices in councils and governments. People vote for political parties that they agree with.



Using a mix of people from different political parties will help make sure that everyone's voice is heard.



We think that this will help local people to get on well.



It will also mean that everyone is more likely to agree on new memorials.

Checking our plans



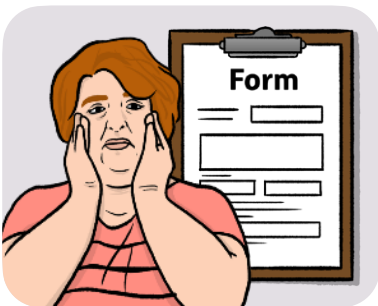
We have checked whether our plans are fair to different local groups. This is called an **Equality Impact Assessment**.



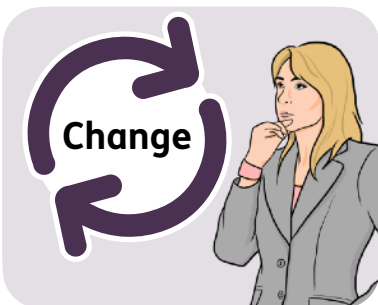
We found that it was fair to most groups.



But to ask for a memorial, people need to fill in a form.



This means that some people might be left out, like if they find reading or writing in English hard.



We might make changes to help people with this.

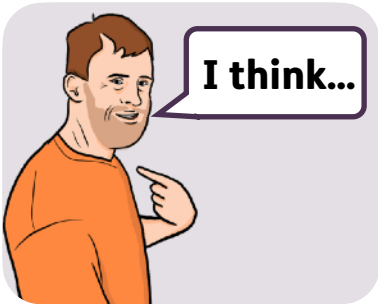
