We are based in the lovely Flowerfield Park which boasts the award-winning Diversity Playpark for children of all abilities and one of only two such parks in Northern Ireland!

Our Facilities

Facilities at Flowerfield include: the "Main Gallery" Suite, comprising of three spacious galleries opening off the Atrium reception area; a 130 seater Auditorium – which includes a Yamaha grand piano and projection facilities; Conference Room; multi-purpose Classroom Studios for arts, crafts and printmaking workshops (with a large intaglio press in situ); Pottery and Glass Craft studios with adjacent kiln rooms; I.T. Media Suite and **FabLab** and the small "Upper Gallery" exhibition space on the first floor.

All of the above spaces are available for hire for a wide range of events. From small meetings to performances in the auditorium or for large conferences with multiple break out spaces, we accommodate external bookings from community/voluntary, statutory organisations and private hire throughout the year. Big Telly

Our Resident Theatre Company

Big Telly is the longest established professional theatre company in Northern Ireland and we are delighted that our 'home' is at Flowerfield Arts Centre.

2017 is the 30th year of Big Telly. Since 1987, we have continued to change and develop whilst still retaining our recognisable style and ethos. When we started, we just made plays. Now we work with more people, artists and places than ever before, across many more artforms and in a huge variety of ways. We use the arts to envision new futures through activities such as activating a public space, animating a community or sparking redevelopment and regeneration.

Recently we've made a photography project, an exhibition of mechanical sculpture, a faerie trail through a park and an audio trail to animate heritage sites.

We make invisible theatre projects where dozens of actors are planted in schools simultaneously to confront young people with an issue, multisite games where teams navigate entire towns undercover, large scale participatory projects like Trade Secrets creating 30 small arts installations each representing the history of a local business, for which we were delighted to win two Arts and Business awards. We're enormously proud of our creative shops project run by Caitriona McLaughlin, building genuine and surprising creative partnerships between artists and communities in places and ways you'd least expect.

And we still make plays. Plays that tour the UK, Ireland and internationally – from Portstewart to Paisley, from Ballycastle to Belgrade, Cushendall to Cardiff, Dunluce to Denmark, Limavady to Leicester and from Torr Head to Taiwan.



Projects to look out for...

'The Life Within' audio trails

'The Life Within' explores the historical significance of five listed buildings in Bushmills through five audio plays which follow the story of characters living in the town in 1897 - the Old Courthouse, the old National School, the Market Square and Clock Tower, Bushmills Inn and a cottage in Shell Row in the town. Listen to the audios via www.big-telly.com and www.bushmillsvillage.co.uk. *This project has been funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) – Sharing Heritage Programme and supported by the Police Service of Northern Ireland and Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council.*

Cloonty Trails

Three audio trails located in the Cloonty townland (Bushmills, Co. Antrim) developed with farmers, older people and primary schools. Two walking trails (starting from Ballylough Living History Trust) and one driving trail (starting from Bushmills village). Listen out for stories about the Kissing Gate, The Grey Lady and the MacQuillan Bride. Audios and further details available via www.big-telly.com. Master of his Craft:

Meet Adam Frew, Ceramicist

Internationally renowned ceramicist Adam Frew has been a craft studio resident at Flowerfield Arts Centre since 2006, when he first began a placement via Craft NI's "Making It" programme.

After completing his term with "Making It" he opted to remain with us, where today he continues to teach and develop his trademark one-off pots and functional works in porcelain. He has now made his home in the Borough and is regarded as one of the many valued professional creatives working in the Causeway Coast community.

Adam's work has attracted an international clientele and he exhibits throughout the UK and Ireland. His work is held in public collections at Mungyeong Ceramic Museum, South Korea, the Arts Council of Northern Ireland, The Law Society of Northern Ireland and the University of Ulster, Belfast, to name a few.



Enrolment. Enrolment forms are available from our reception team or you can phone us on Tel: 028 7083 1400 to make an enrolment. Please note places do go quickly and we cannot unfortunately hold them.

Parental Consent. When enrolling, complete the form in full, giving name of child & age at last birthday, contact numbers and full address - also sign the 'Parental Consent' section on the back of the form. If enrolling by phone, the receptionist will take these details and the parent or guardian must sign the consent form on the first day of the child's attendance.

Photography - for archives and publicity, we may photograph the children in their workshop. We always ask permission from parents and guardians to do this, so if you do not want your child to be included in the photo, please confirm on the enrolment form.



Well-made plaster moulds make it possible for potters to make several uniform pieces and can save time to concentrate on the patterns and surface decorations. It worked for Mr Wedgwood!

Sculptural Slip Casting

Following on from the mould making workshop, Ceramicist, Gail Mahon is delivering this one and a half day workshop in Slip Casting techniques. This pottery technique using liquid clay is suited to the mass-production of pottery and ceramics and especially for shapes not easily made on a wheel e.g. decorative reliefs, handles or other trims. Spend a day with Alex Scott and meet one of Ireland's greatest contemporary ceramicists. Born in Coleraine, Alex is a ceramics artist /designer. A graduate of the Royal College of Art in London, his long professional career has established an acclaimed profile as tableware designer in industry, lecturer and maker. His bold sculptural forms moulded and constructed in stoneware clay are influenced by a formalist, asymmetric aesthetic founded upon his experience of industrial techniques and recent research visits to China. His work has been exhibited internationally and can be found in many private and public collections.

Using lampworking techniques in glass bead-making with Glass maker, Catherine Keenan. Using gloriously coloured stringers (glass rods) students will be guided through the very basics of this skill and produce their own unique lamp worked beads to use as jewellery.

*N.B. **Lampworking** is a type of glasswork where a hand held torch or lamp is used to melt the glass, once in a molten state it is formed into decorative beads.*

Fused Glass Chimes & Sun-catcher Decoration

Design & create your own special Wind-chimes or an elegant Sun-catcher for your house or garden from fused coloured glass. Glassmaker Natasha Duddy will guide you through the cut, fuse and slump process of warm glass making. Suitable for students of all abilities. **Max 10 places**



Pate de Verre Glass

Tuesday 15 August, 10am-4pm

Cost: £45

Pate de verre or 'glass paste', is finely crushed glass (frit) combined with glue and pressed into moulds to form thin walled glass pieces. One advantage of this technique is that it lets the maker to precisely place colours in a way other glass casting techniques don't allow. During this fun hands-on class, you will learn how to create a pate de verre vessel and a flat personalized piece of pate de verre. Suitable for beginners, no previous experience is necessary. All equipment and glass will be supplied, but please dress for mess!




Fused Glass Slumped Plates and Bowls

Friday 18 August, 10am-3pm.

Cost: £45

After a brief health and safety talk and glass cutting demonstration, students will explore the use of line and colour to design and produce a flat piece of glass using geometric patterns. Kiln Firing (a 2 day fusing process) follows and then the tutor will refire work into the student's chosen moulds to produce their own unique 3D plates or bowls. **Max 10 Places**



Fused Glass Imaging
