Publication of Preferred Options Paper (POP)

In accordance with Regulation 10 of the Planning (Local Development Plan) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015, Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council hereby gives notice that it published its Local Development Plan Preferred Options Paper (POP) on 26th June 2018 for public consultation.

The POP is the first of three main public consultation documents that the Council will issue during the Plan preparation.

It is designed to promote focused debate on key issues of strategic significance which are likely to influence the direction of future development within the Borough up to 2030.

The POP outlines the vision and strategic objectives of the Plan, along with a set of key issues and the possible options available to address them, including the Council's 'preferred option'.

The POP is accompanied by a Sustainability Appraisal [Scoping and Interim Reports, including Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) and Habitats Regulation Assessment (HRA) Baseline Study] and an Equality Statement.
