The purpose of this report is to provide elected members with an update on the work undertaken by the Causeway Coast and Glens Heritage Trust (CCGHT) in conjunction with the Council's Coast and Countryside team over the last year, and to outline the proposed partnership agreement for delivery of services in 2018-19.

### **Background**

The Council funded Causeway Coast & Glens Heritage Trust (CCGHT) for the period of 1st April 2017 – 31<sup>st</sup> March 2018. The total amount of funding awarded was £35,000 and the amount awarded was subject to the delivery of a number of specific activities.

The Heritage Trust's key activities are based around the development and implementation of a number of environmental and landscape management plans including those for the Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB); Binevenagh, the Causeway Coast and the Antrim Coast and Glens.

The agreement to fund this organisation will be based on the premise that the Council's Coast and Countryside remit will be complimented by the activities provided by CCGHT. In addition, any financial transaction will be based on a single tender action for services that only the CCGHT can provide as specialists in this area of work.

### Services provided in 2017- 2018

A contract for services was approved by Council in June 2017 and within this a number of defined activities with specific outputs have been undertaken by CCGHT.

Causeway Coast and Glens Heritage Trust projects completed in partnership with the Council and providing direct benefit to the area in the past year include:

- Coordination of the of 3 AONB management plans in the CCGBC area.
- Development and co-ordination of the management of the Giant's Causeway and Causeway Coast World Heritage Site steering committee.
- Coordination and implementation of the Heart of the Glens Landscape Partnership Scheme.
- Coordination of a series of outdoor and heritage events across the Council area.

- Access improvement and interpretation schemes.

Additional Services to be provided by CCGHT on behalf of Council during 2017-2018 include;

- Contribute to Council's activities in managing coastal environments.
- Delivering opportunities to experience the Causeway Coast and Glens Council area's unique outdoor and heritage though public events.
- Develop geodiversity opportunities for trade, visitors, education and community engagement.
- Assist Council with the delivery and promotion of biodiversity related prospects.
- Preparation and submission of an application for Binevenagh and Coastal Lowlands Landscape Partnership Scheme.
- Analysis of the overseas walking market for the Causeway Coast & Glens area.
- Submit an application through HLF for the landscape Partnership Scheme for the Binevenagh and coastal low lands.

The outputs from last year's work plan have been reviewed by the Council's Funding Unit and the Coast and Countryside Team. Certain elements have yet to be completed and Officials expect these to be completed by the end of the year plan dated July 2018.

### Funding/Support for 2018-2019

Council's financial support continues to play a vital role in sustaining CCGHT. Council's commitment will be subject to funding made available from NIEA, Tourism NI and Mid and East Antrim, who have all made an allowance for financial contribution for agreed services. With Members' approval, Officers would recommend a contribution of up to £35,000 to support the Heritage Trust activities from June 2018 to April 2019, subject to successful completion of the outputs as set out in **Annex A.** 

#### Recommendation

The Leisure and Development Committee are asked to consider and approve the proposed funding of £35,000 to CCGHT for services proposed within Annex A, this is subject to a staged approval and satisfactory delivery of the outputs as detailed.
