Antrim BT54 6HY		B1	57 Hillside Road is an isolated two-storey, three bay farm house with attic, which may contain fabric dating from the eighteenth century. The rear of the house is of interest, having an earlier appearance than the front, which is characterised by a mid-to-late nineteenth century appearance, particularly internally. The interior is well preserved and contains elements typical of a modest farm dwelling of the nineteenth century, including timber partitions and good, varied examples of pigmented limewash. The house is a fine example of an evolved vernacular farm dwelling in its original setting, of a type once common in the Ulster countryside, now increasingly rare. Interest is enhanced by the survival of an original farm complex, containing a modified dwelling, located adjacent to the house.	1820 - 1839


WHEREAS
