The purpose of this report is to provide elected members with an update on the work carried out by Council, in partnership with the Causeway Coast and Glens Heritage Trust (CCGHT) over the past 12 months and to outline potential partnership arrangements for delivery of services for 2016-17.

Background

Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council funded Causeway Coast & Glens Heritage Trust (CCGHT) for the period of 1st April 2015 – 31st of March 2016. The total amount of funding awarded was £38,000. Prior to this the legacy Councils had provided financial support since 2003 under agreed 'Service Level Agreements.'

Moving forward, any agreement to fund this organisation will be based on the fact that the Council's Coast and Countryside remit will be complemented by the activities provided by the Heritage Trust. In addition, any financial transaction will be based on a single tender action for services that only the Heritage Trust can provide as specialists in this area of work.

The main focus of the Heritage Trust is based around the development and implementation of a number of environmental and landscape management plans including the Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) of Binevenagh, the Causeway Coast and the Antrim Coast and Glens. The Heritage Trust also has a role working on a regional basis to develop awareness of environmental management and to promote sustainable tourism.

The funding for the Heritage Trust has included monies from NIEA (£150,000) and Tourism NI (£20,000,). Mid and East Antrim Borough Council has also allowed for a £22,000 financial contribution for agreed services. In addition to the above core funding, the Heritage Trust has received project and revenue funding through the Heritage Lottery Fund, under the Landscape Partnership Scheme.

Services provided in 2015-2016

The Causeway Coast and Glens area has benefited from working in partnership with the Heritage Trust over the past year on the development of a number of environmental and tourism related projects, along with the implementation of management and action plans for the Causeway Coast, Binevenagh and the Antrim Coast and Glens Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty. (AONB)

Causeway Coast and Glens Heritage Trust projects completed in partnership with the Council and providing direct benefit to the area in the past year are as follows. Full details are listed in Annex A:

- Co-ordination of the of 3 AONB management plans in the CCGBC area.
- Development and co-ordination of the management of the *Giant's Causeway and Causeway Coast World Heritage Site steering committee.*
- Co-ordination and implementation of the Heart of the Glens Landscape Partnership Scheme.
- Co-ordination of a series of outdoor and heritage events across the Council area.
- Feasibility Study into the creation of a greenway between Ballymoney and Ballycastle.
- Cregagh Wood, Cushendun access and interpretation scheme.
- Bonamargy Friary,-Ballycastle repairs to Council owned boundary wall.
- Fairhead Walks access and interpretation scheme.
- Moyle Way way-marking scheme.
- Ossian's Grave access scheme.
- Cottage Wood, Cushendall tree planting.
- Glenariff Beach Front access and improvement scheme.
- A signage review for Binevenagh AONB (This will allow improved future visitor information and interpretation).

Required service provision for 2016-2017 identified by Council officers that can support the Destination Management Strategy and specifically the Coast and Countryside remit include:

- A review of the Mountain Bike vacation sector and an assessment of the potential for creation of a 'destination experience' for the Council area.
- The establishment of a Junior Rangers Programme for AONB areas and development of an educational programme through schools and youth groups to assist our Biodiversity function.

 Development of the Sustainable Tourism Charter for the area and the development of Toolkits to be rolled out for the benefit of identified stakeholders and local tourism trade.

Annex B details these requirements and further projects that have been costed at an agreed hourly rate and outputs applied.

In addition, the Heritage Trust will be expected to assist with broader overall objectives of the Tourism and Recreation remit, with recognition that protected area management is vital to the Causeway Coast and Glens, where 98% of the Borough's coastline lies within an AONB.

Funding/ Support

Council's financial support is important as it helps to sustain this organisation and lever other substantial funding into the region. The Heritage Trust, as with other similar groups in the current funding environment has received year on year funding which is a major challenge in terms of long term planning. Over the course of this year, officers would like to explore the possibility of a 3 year financial package which would provide the Heritage Trust with a more sustainable and secure base on which to operate. This would be based on the fact that as specialist local provider, any agreement will be procured under the Council's policy for procurement under a single tender action approach. In the interim, a one year agreement is recommended.

Options for consideration

Option 1

Council does not procure any services from the Causeway Coast and Glens Heritage Trust for any activities for year 2016-2017.

Option 2

Council agrees to procure the entire services as detailed in Annex B from Causeway Coast and Glens Heritage Trust. The total cost for this work is £35,000.

Option 3

Council agrees to procure only a number of the requirements of Annex B. This will require a reduction in the number of projects delivered and therefore the cost to Council will be reduced proportionately.

Recommendations

- Option 2 Council funds the Causeway Coast and Glens Heritage Trust for services proposed within the 2016-2017 Action Plan (Annex B) up to a maximum of £35,000. This is subject to staged approval and satisfactory delivery of the outputs as detailed in Annex B.
- The Tourism and Recreation Service monitors delivery and reports on the effectiveness of outputs and makes recommendations of future delivery models, including the possibility of a 3 year financial package.
- The Causeway Coast and Glens Heritage Trust Chief Executive and Board Chairman present to the Leisure and Development Committee in autumn 2016, outlining the Heritage Trust's activities.
