Proposed Event	Budget
1. Create Rosebed at Cloonavin (QEII Roses) – be planted on Queen's Birthday 21 st April.	£1,600
2. Beacons across UK and Commonwealth on 21 st April. – relay from each of the four legacy areas converging in Portstewart for lighting of beacon, in association with local running/cycling clubs.	£1,500

3. Afternoon Tea for residents who share a 1926 birthday with the Queen – hosted by The Mayor & HML incl entertainment & gift. (May - dates TBC) Co. Antrim residents (Ballymoney) Co. Londonderry residents (Coleraine)	£1,000
4. Publicity/ general expenses	£2,500
