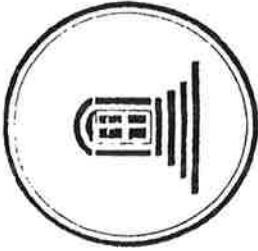

Antrim BT52 8BN		B1	Terraced two-bay three-storey rendered building, built c. 1890 with projecting ground floor retail unit and entrance hall c. 1910. Built as one of three similar buildings this example appears to have been completely remodelled in the early twentieth-century giving the building its current appearance. Although interconnected with the adjoining department store, the building has retained much of its rich internal fittings and an impressive doorcase adding a further layer of interest to the terrace and the wider streetscape.	1880 - 1899

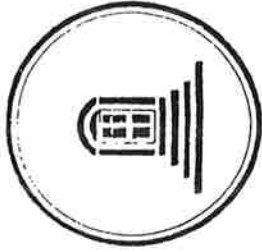

Antrim BT52 8BN		B1	Former pair of terraced three-storey rendered buildings, built c. 1890, with projecting ground floor shopfronts inserted c. 1920. Built as one of three similar buildings these two examples have been amalgamated into a single unit and interconnected to the Atlantic Bar. Though no original bar counter remains, at first and second floor much of the early 20th Century internal joinery remains. Despite being interconnected at first and second floor during its time in the early 20th C to serve as a hotel, the buildings are still readable as several units externally with the Art Nouveau decorative ground floor additions clearly defining the division. The set of interconnecting buildings contributes to an attractive group of early twentieth-century shopfronts in the centre of Portrush, giving the listing group value..	1880 - 1899


