Antrim BT54 6JJ		B1	<p>Architecturally, the block comprising the mill, store and seed house are of interest in exhibiting at least two phases of development - a single-storey late 18th/early 19th C corn mill and 1870s enlargement to its present form and multiple functions. It is one of a number of vernacular buildings within this complex, and its rural riverside setting is largely unchanged.</p> <p>The original fabric of the mill block exhibits minor alterations which reflect its continuing use up to the mid-1900s. Of special note is the survival of the stone lining to the races and of the waterwheel. Although the three pairs of millstones and most of the power transmission gearing have been dismantled, the surviving power transmission to the roller and grinding mills are of historical interest in reflecting how milling technology changed during the 1900s. The mill was of economic value to the agricultural economy of this area and is of local industrial heritage interest.</p>	1860 - 1879


STATUTORY LIST OF BUILDINGS OF SPECIAL ARCHITECTURAL OR HISTORIC INTEREST

WHEREAS

1. by section 80 of the Planning Act (Northern Ireland) 2011 the Department for Communities (hereinafter called "the Department") is required to compile lists of buildings of special architectural or historic interest;
2. it appears to the Department that the buildings described in the attached Schedule are buildings of special architectural or historic interest;
3. the Department has consulted with the Historic Buildings Council and Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council.

NOW THEREFORE the Department in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 80 of the Planning Act (Northern Ireland) 2011 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf hereby includes on the list of buildings of special architectural or historic interest the building/s set out in the attached schedule.
