### **Background**

Further to an Environmental Service report item (May 2015) which proposed options to members regarding bus shelter provisions within the Borough

No guidance is currently available to Council officers to deliver the provision of bus shelters within the Borough.

Two recommendations proposed in May's report included;

- A. Council reach a decision to continue to provide new bus shelters or not.
- B. If Council decide to continue new provisions, then it is recommended that Council approve the recommended guidelines to bring a structure and ethos to this delivery.

However members requested further information, which included;

- 1. Total number of Transport NI shelters within the Borough
- 2. Total number of Council shelters within the Borough
- 3. Footfall usage utilising existing bus shelters.
